Get it right

TM is:

"A mark, used, or designate to be used, by a person, regarding the goods he manufactures or the good he trades in"

TM is valid to registration:

once it has a distinguish character, which distinguishes it between the TM owner's goods and the other's goods

Directing

Israel is a member of the Madrid Protocol

- Classification: Made by several categories, in accordance with the product's on which the TM is requested
- Validity: Territorial (IL only)
- Protection scope (10 years and Renewal):
 - A. Registered TM's Owner unique right of use
 - B. Registered TM's Owner right to prevent use of resemble mark in the same Classification

IL Registration Procedure

Approx. 1 year

- Examination
 - + should have: Distinguished Character
 - shouldn't have: mislead the public OR perform an unfair competition
- Allowance & Publication
 oppositions allowed within 3 months
- Registration

no opposition OR an opposition was ruled in favor of the TM's applicant

Mark your Trade Register IL TM

Israel has a very efficient channel of TM rights enforcement:

owners of <u>registered</u> IL trademarks may use the Custom Authorities (CA) to protect their rights against importation of infringing goods (including shipments destined to the Palestinian Authority) by preventing their entrance into the country

CA Guidelines

Efficient, Fast and Simple System

The CA Regulation – Step by Step

STEP 1: Imports of infringing goods will be detained in two cases:

- **A.** When a right holder asks to **block entrance** to Israel of a **specific** shipment of infringing goods.
- **B.** When a right holder asks to **monitor and sample** shipments on a **constant basis** based on registered trademarks stored in the CA's data base, and to detain the infringing goods that will be discovered.

STEP 2: CA TM Enforcement

- 1. Filing a notification which includes the TM registration certificate
- 2. Infringing goods will be detained for 3 days Customs await TM owner's written Opinion indicating infringement + obligation to take legal action against the importer + deposit of bank guarantee
- 3. Infringing goods will be detained for 10 more days Customs await TM owner's to file a lawsuit against the infringing importer
- 4. CA will not release the infringing goods until ordered to do so by the court
- 5. Court may order the CA to destroy the infringing goods, to confiscate them or to release them under restrictive conditions, such as removal of the infringing labels, tags, etc.

- + Temporary Injunction
 In both Registered and
 Unregistered (but well-known) TM
- + Compensation

2. CIVIL WRONGS ACT

Statutory Compensation - 100,000 NIS

per each violation,

no damages evidence procedures (Approx.' 25,000 UDS)

Shortcuts

Skipping step 2

- The new regulation rules small
 amounts of infringing goods are seized
 and destroyed within weeks
- No legal procedure

EXTRAS

- + Deterring: high storage costs at the port's warehouse, often cause the importers, at a very early stage, to abandon the shipment and to ask for its destruction
- + Streamlining: CA often provides TM owners with valuable information required for the enforcement of their rights in other arenas

- + Preventive enforcement
- + Cost efficiency

Blocking infringing goods before they cross the borders is by far more efficient and cost effective than searching for them
